Sewing Machine Threading Instructions, Quick Tips and Anatomy

Threading the machine:

- 1. Put spool of thread on spool pin and put stopper on after thread spool.
- 2. Take the thread under the first thread guide, then follow the 1 and 2 arrows to the take-up lever.
- 3. Catch thread from right to left in the take-up lever at the 3 arrow, then pull thread straight down toward the needle.
- 4. Catch the thread in the thread guide directly above the needle.
- 5. Thread the needle front to back, being careful not to twist thread around the needle.
- 6. Pull about 6 inches of thread through the needle and to the left.
- 7. Insert filled bobbin (see next page for instructions on filling) into the bobbin case so that it will unwind counterclockwise.
- 8. Catch bobbin thread in the thread guides in the bobbin case, pulling down into the middle groove and to the left to lock.
- 9. Hold the top thread exiting the needle with your left hand and rotate the hand-crank towards you through one complete stitch cycle. This should pass the top thread over the bobbin, catching the bobbin thread and pulling it up through the throat-plate and foot as a loop over the top thread.
- 10. Gently tease the bobbin thread completely up through the throat plate until you have the end.
- 11. Put bobbin case top in place and press down to lock.
- 12. Make sure both top thread and bobbin thread are set between the foot and throat plate with 6+ inches of thread exiting the left or rear of the machine.
- 13. You are now ready to sew. Please be sure to check that your stitch and length selectors and tension wheel are set correctly before you begin.

Filling the Bobbin:

- 1. Put spool of thread on spool pin and put stopper on after thread spool.
- 2. Pull thread around the bobbin tension disc and to the right towards the bobbin winder.
- 3. Insert the end of thread into the small hole in the bobbin from the inside out the top.
- 4. Put the bobbin on the bobbin winder pressing down to lock.
- 5. Push the bobbin winder to the right towards the stopper to engage.
- 6. Pull the hand-crank out to disengage the needle.
- 7. While holding the excess thread from the bobbin above the winder, press the foot pedal to fill up the bobbin (you may let go of the excess thread after a layer of thread has built up on the bobbin).
- 8. Stop filling the bobbin when it hits the stopper, the bobbin should be full and tight but not bursting over the edges.
- 9. Cut thread between the bobbin and the bobbin winder tension disc.
- 10. Push the bobbin winder to the left to disengage and pull the bobbin up and off.
- 11. Push the hand-crank back in to reengage the needle.
- 12. Thread the machine as normal.

Quick Tips:

- Always turn the hand-crank towards yourself (so your thumb passes down the front).
- The first trouble-shooting step is to unthread and rethread the machine, this fixes most simple issues.
- When back-stitching, hold the back-stitch button all the way down the entire time you intend to backstitch.
- If the needle isn't moving, check to make sure the hand-crank is pushed in and reengaged the needle.
- To utilize the pink stitch styles, turn the length selector to the SS at the bottom of the wheel, and turn
 the stitch selector to the desired letter.
